Doctoral Program in Business Administration

IESE is offering eight full fellowships to outstanding students wishing to develop their doctoral thesis in the field of management.

Examples of these areas are:

- Organizing Cooperation
- New Technologies and Management: Practice and Management Education
- Ethical Foundations in Management
- Service Management
- Organizational Behavior and Human Resource Management
- Management of Knowledge
- Control
- Corporate Governance
- Economics and Management

Presentation of applications

Applications should be sent to the Doctoral Program Office at IESE together with the documents required for admission to the Program, before March 30 (for admission in the following academic year, starting September) In exceptional cases, when fellowships are still available, applications will be accepted after that date.

The applications for fellowships will be examined by an Academic Committee, composed of IESE's Secretary General, the Research Director and the Director of the Doctoral Program. This Committee will base its decision on the academic standards of applicants and the potential contribution to the selected area of research.

Amount and form of payment

The fellowships will cover tuition and living expenses for up to four years if the student reaches the expected academic standards. This will amount to a total of 21,305 €, of which 9,015 euros correspond to tuition and the remaining (12,020 €)¹ to living expenses.

Each fellowship will be paid in four quarterly payments from October to the following September.

Fellowship conditions

These fellowships do not create any employment relationship with IESE, nor do they imply that IESE will necessarily include fellowship holders in its staff in the future.

The fellowships may be renewed each year conditional upon the student's academic performance during his/her doctoral studies (this evaluation will be based on the performance in courses and seminars during the first two years and the contribution to research in the advanced phases of the Program) and will take place each March prior to the following academic year.

Receiving an IESE fellowship implies working as research assistant, after the first year of the PhD Program.

¹ These fellowships will be subjected to the withholdings required by applicable tax law.
