This dichotomy gives rise to the book (in Spanish) whose title translates as *Everything Is Terrible, but I'm Fine*. In it, IESE Prof. José Luis Nuño, the Intent HQ Chair on Changing Consumer Behavior, analyzes data on 200 million purchasing actions between January 2022 and March 2023 to recommend how retailers can entice consumers amid the cost-of-living crisis.
